


### What is an ATLAS Virtual Visit?

- Conversation between physicists in the ATLAS Control Room with the public via video conference
- Remote tour of the Control Room with explanations of the operational controls and screen content
- Candid discussion of current events in ATLAS, the LHC, CERN, particle physics and science, in general
- Public webcast of the event to interested classmates, parents, teachers and the public, at large
- Recording of the event for future reference in the classroom and at home
- New tool to improve our ability to converse with the public, regardless of geographical location
- Number of Annual Visits increased from 6 in 2011 to 65 in 2013


