

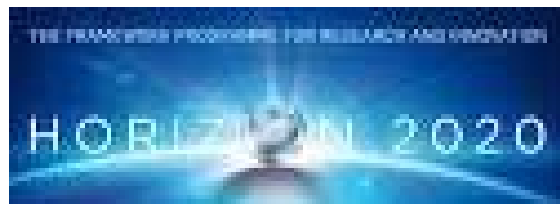

Academic sector

Academic sector consists of public or private higher education establishments awarding academic degrees, public or private non-profit research organisations whose primary mission is to pursue research, and international European interest organisations.

Non-academic sector

Non-academic sector includes any socio-economic actor not included in the academic sector and fulfilling the requirements of the Horizon 2020 Rules for Participation.

Beneficiaries: signatory of the agreement

Beneficiaries are full partners with complete responsibility for executing the proposed programme and other requirements of the project. They **contribute directly** to the implementation of the research training programme by **appointing, supervising, hosting and training researchers. They may also provide secondment opportunities.**

Partner organisations: non-signatory of the agreement

Partner organisations are non-beneficiary organisations contributing to the project by providing training and hosting researchers during **secondments**. Partner organisations do not employ researchers within the project.

Mobility rule

The researcher must not have resided or carried out his/her main activity in the country of the host organisation for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately prior to:

- a) The deadline for submission of proposals (*Individual Fellowships – COFUND)
- b) The date of the first contract (ITN – COFUND)

*Specific mobility rule applies to Restart Career Panel (CAR) and Reintegration Panel (RI) The researcher must not have resided or carried out his/her main activity in the country of the host organisation for more than 36 months in the 5 years immediately prior to the call deadline.

Early-Stage Researchers (ESRs) shall, at the time of recruitment by the host organisation, be in the first four years (*full-time equivalent research experience*) of their research careers and have not been awarded a doctoral degree.

Full-Time Equivalent Research Experience is measured from the date when a researcher obtained the degree which would formally entitle him/her to embark on a doctorate, either in the country in which the degree was obtained or in the country in which the researcher is recruited or seconded, irrespective of whether or not a doctorate is or was ever envisaged.

Fellowships: from 3 months to 36 months

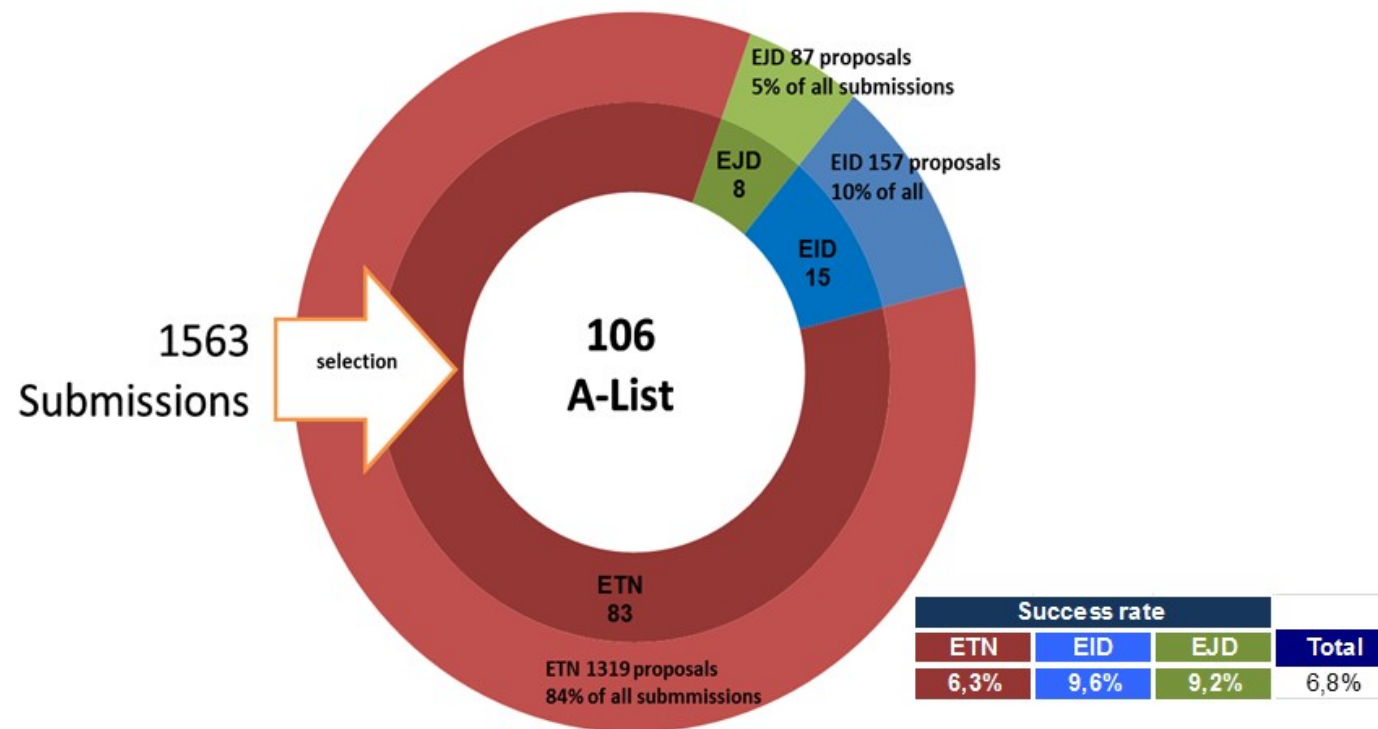

FET Open supports early-stage research on any idea for a new technology. There are no pre-defined themes. It encourages scientists and engineers from multiple disciplines to work together on game-changing science- and technology research, expanding well beyond the traditional technological disciplines.



FET gatekeepers - the kind of research that FET is looking for

Long-term vision: a new, original or radical long-term vision of technology-enabled possibilities going far beyond the state of the art

Breakthrough S&T target: scientifically ambitious and technologically concrete breakthroughs plausibly attainable within the life-time of the project.

Foundational: the breakthroughs must be foundational in the sense that they can establish a basis for a new line of technology not currently anticipated.

Novelty: new ideas and concepts, rather than the application or incremental refinement of existing ones.

High-risk: the potential of a new technological direction depends on a whole range of factors that cannot be apprehended from a single disciplinary viewpoint.

Interdisciplinary: the proposed collaborations must go beyond current mainstream collaboration configurations in joint S&T research, and must aim to advance different scientific and technological disciplines together and in synergy towards a breakthrough.
